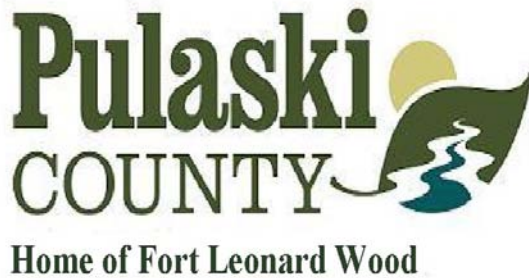


**Pulaski County, Missouri

## ***Are you ready to explore the natural beauty of the Ozarks?***

Just grab a picnic lunch, jump in your car, and visit one of these beautiful areas. They are just a few minutes away.

- ***Confluence of the Roubidoux Creek and the Gasconade River.***  
North of Waynesville on Hwy 17 at the first bridge.
- ***Clifty Natural Bridge***  
I-44 Exit 163, north on Hwy 28 to Dixon.
- Beautiful site listed as a Missouri State geologic oddity.
- ***Mill Creek and Paddy Creek in the Mark Twain National Forest.***  
1 and 19 mile trails for hiking and horseback riding.
- ***Ft. Leonard Wood is a State Wildlife Management Area.***
- ***Trophy trout fishing*** along the ***Roubidoux River. Floating and Fishing*** along the ***Gasconade River***, Missouri's longest river, or the ***Big Piney River***, scenic beauty at its best.
- ***Scenic Natural Springs: Boiling, Roubidoux and Pippin.***

## ***Interesting Story Leads***

***Historic Route 66-*** Devil's Elbow, named from the scenic bluffs such as the Sugar Bowls, view the 1940 Railroad trestle, and original motor court motels. Piney Beach Cabins along Historic Route 66 have been newly renovated, with care, to preserve the original 1940's style.

***Agritourism*** -Visit a working horse farm, fish farm or an Alpaca Ranch with alpaca wool product, farm visits and a petting zoo.

***Unique Experiences*** -The Cave Restaurant and Resort, a restaurant in a real cave and resort with cabins and a stocked catfish pond. Portuguese Point: Beautiful scenic view overlooking the Gasconade River. Past railroad hub towns with the extinct railroad caboose located in Crocker, St.Robert, Dixon and Richland. Underwater cave diving for certified divers at Roubidoux Springs.

***Historical Influences*** -WWII buildings, Military sites and Civil War sites; Old Stagecoach Stop Museum; Pulaski County Courthouse built in 1903, features the original courtroom, wood floors and seating; National trail along the Trail of Tears

***Annual Community Festivals and Events*** - Sportsman Outdoor Show, Kickapoo Trace Muzzleloaders 1840s & Black Powder Show, Frog Fest, ATV Rodeo, Pulaski County Fair, Old Settler's Day, Labor Day Celebration, Dixon Cow Days, Richland Founder's Day.

***Rustic Resorts*** -Wilderness Ridge Resort boasts several lodging options, including a log cabin built in 1932 overlooking the Big Piney River while Gasconade Hills Resort offers a variety of rustic cottages and cabins from the 1930's with lovely scenery on the Gasconade River.
