## Parks & Recreation

For families and outdoor enthusiasts, Richland is ideal, boasting a challenging nine-hole community golf course, two scenic rivers, a beautiful city park, and nearby Lake of the Ozarks with world class golf and fishing.



Shady Dell Park, in the heart of town, is a 20 acre site with tennis courts, a lighted baseball field, picnic areas, volleyball court, Olympic size pool, walking trail, pulling track, playgrounds and a community building of 4,000 square feet with full kitchen that is available for rent by the day.

Winding for 30 miles through the hills around Richland is Missouri's Gasconade River, and nearby is a second major waterway, the Big Piney, identified as one of the most scenic rivers in the U.S. to float.

When the weather keeps you indoors, the county hosts 5 museums with one dating back to the Civil War Era.

## City Services

Richland's government functions are managed by a professional administrator under the direction of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen. The city provides municipal services including water, electricity, natural gas, and sewage treatment. The city also maintains a commercial and residential street system with over 30 miles of improved streets. Richland has a municipal airport with 3,000 feet of hard surface runway.

Another asset is an enhanced 911 emergency system which provides immediate response from police, ambulance, and fire protection on a 24 hour basis.

## Education

With 585 students in the district there is an average of 1 teacher for every 18 students. Each elementary classroom has a smart board and in grades 4-6 there is a computer for every 2 students. Keyboarding is taught in grades 1-3. Our Kindergarten through 3rd grades are Reading First classrooms providing 90 minutes of uninterrupted reading instruction daily. Education is a priority in this school district. The Richland High School academic team is known statewide for its 13 Class 2A state titles in the last fourteen years.



## Health Care

Hometown friendliness combined with superb care and modern facilities describe the health care services offered in Richland. Our town features two fine medical centers as well as private doctors, dentists, chiropractors, and veterinarians for pet lovers.

Central Ozarks Medical Center is one of 20 National Health Service affiliated clinics in a four-state area. It has 16 treatment rooms as well as a large emergency room and well-equipped lab. Several physicians are on the staff, and for severe emergencies, patients can be moved by air ambulance to Lake of the Ozarks Hospital 15 minutes away.

St. John's Clinic includes an M.D. and nurse practitioner.

The town also boasts a full service nursing home, a hometown pharmacy, an assisted living facility, and an active Senior Center.
