# Ft. Leonard Wood the only location with 3 U.S. Army Branch Museums

## Mahaffey Museum Complex

This museum facility is the repository for the material histories of three Army TRADOC museums branches and the post of Fort Leonard Wood. This has been the home of the Fort Leonard Wood Museum and the Army Engineer Museum since 1989. The Army Chemical Corps and Military Police Corps museums were re-established here in 2000 after a BRAC move from Fort McClellan, AL. The museums preserve and exhibit important Army artifacts and support Soldier education. These museums are part of the U.S. Center of Military History, which administers over 60 Army museums and historical collections across the country.



## The Engineer Museum

The U.S. Army Engineer Museum is a federal museum, chartered through the United States Army. It offers a variety of gallery displays including: WWII temporary mobilization buildings, the development of American Army engineering equipment, topographic engineering, land mine warfare, tactical bridging, special weapons, and much more.



## The Military Police Museum

The museum chronicles the evolution of the Military Police branch and its functions to support the US Army from the American Revolution through the formal establishment of the branch in 1941 up to the present day. The museum contains historic artifacts, artwork, and dioramas to illustrate the three disciplines of Security and Mobility Support, Police Operations, and Detention Operations.



## The Chemical Warfare Museum

Since its inception in 1918, the Chemical Corps has been the nation's protective force against chemical, biological, radiological and nuclear (CBRN) threats. A self-guided tour to the 6000+ square foot museum offers full size immersion dioramas, audio, and video programs, and exhibit cases that house some of the 6,600 artifacts in the collection.



## Memorial Grove Areas

Fort Leonard Wood has a rich history that dates back to World War II and was named after General Leonard Wood. Many soldiers have trained and served our country at Fort Leonard Wood and many have also paid the ultimate sacrifice.

Memorial Grove is a serene location for soldiers, past and present, to reflect and to pay respect to fallen comrades. You can visit the grove just about any time of day and you will see people of all ages paying homage to our heroes.
